After the man had calmed down, he begins to feel guilty about what he had done, his son never asks for money very often. He goes to his son's room to check on the boy, as he knocks on the door he asks his son if he is asleep, the boy says he was not. The father apologises to his son and gives him the \$20. Thanking his father, the boy reaches under his pillow and pulls out various cash notes and coins. Furious that his son already had money the man is just about to yell at his son when he hears the boy say "Daddy, I now have \$40, can I buy an hour of your time? Please come home an hour early tomorrow? I'd like to have dinner with you."

It's just a short reminder to all of you working so hard in life. We should not let time slip through our fingers without having spent some time with those who really matter to us, those close to our hearts.
